SUSTAINABLE NUTRITION

foods are good for us and they don't need as many resources like water and land compared to meat. Plus, they're full of vitamins and minerals that help us feel our best.

Secondly, we can try to buy food that is grown locally. That means the food doesn't have to travel far to get to our plates. When we buy local food, we help reduce pollution from transportation, and we support our local farmers too.

Another important thing is to not waste food. Every time we throw away food, we waste all the resources it took to grow, harvest, and transport it. We can try to reduce waste by only taking what we need and save leftovers for later. We can also compost food scraps instead of throwing them in the trash.

We should also learn about where our food comes from. Some farms use chemicals that can hurt the environment. Choosing to eat foods without harmful chemicals can be better for our planet and our health.

Lastly, we can eat more foods that are in season. When we eat fruits and vegetables that are in season, they taste better and are usually cheaper too. Plus, they don't need as much energy to grow because they're already suited to the weather at that time of year. In conclusion, sustainable nutrition is all about making choices that are good for us and for the Earth.
