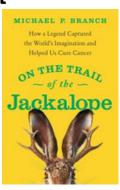

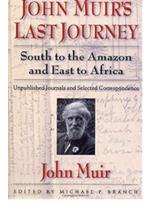

# TEN EASY AND HEALTHY SIDE DISHES TO ADD TO YOUR BARBEQUE

This time of year, brings outdoor eating and barbecuing your favorite meals. Try these easy-yet delicious sides for a healthy addition to your meals this summer. In addition to BBQ chicken or salmon try adding fresh fruits and veggies as a side dish as an effortless way to get vital nutrients into your day. Remember the key to meal planning is creating balance! So don't forget to add some whole grains, vegetables, and fruit to your meals or to bring along to a gathering for everyone to enjoy!

For a balanced BBQ spread, consider these healthy side dishes:

1. Grilled Vegetables: Marinate vegetables like bell peppers, zucchini, eggplant, and mushrooms in olive oil, garlic, and herbs, then grill until tender. They are flavorful and packed with nutrients.

2. Quinoa Salad: Combine cooked quinoa with diced veggies like cucumber, cherry tomatoes, and bell peppers. Toss with a light vinaigrette dressing for a

refreshing side dish.

3. Corn on the Cob: Grilled corn on the cob is a classic BBQ side. Brush with a little olive oil and sprinkle with chili powder or lime juice for extra flavor.

- 4. Mixed Green Salad: Create a simple salad with mixed greens, cherry tomatoes, sliced cucumbers, and a balsamic vinaigrette dressing. Add nuts or seeds for extra crunch.
- 5. Fruit Salad: Combine a variety of fresh fruits like berries, melon, pineapple, and grapes for a colorful and refreshing side dish. You can also drizzle with a bit of honey or lime juice.
- 6. Cucumber Salad: Thinly slice cucumbers and red onions, then toss with a light dressing made of vinegar, olive oil, and dill. It is a crisp and refreshing
- 7. Bean Salad: Mix cooked beans (like black beans or chickpeas), diced bell peppers, red onions, and cilantro. Dress with a lime vinaigrette for a proteinpacked side dish.
- 8. Stuffed Bell Peppers: Fill halved bell peppers with a mixture of quinoa, black beans, corn, and diced tomatoes. Bake until peppers are tender for a satisfying and healthy side.

9. Caprese Salad: Layer slices of fresh tomatoes, mozzarella cheese, and basil leaves on a platter. Drizzle with balsamic glaze and olive oil for a simple

yet elegant side dish.

10. Sweet Potato Wedges: Cut sweet potatoes into wedges, toss with olive oil and seasonings, then bake until crispy. They are a nutritious alternative to traditional fries.
